is not fiction michael herr covered the war for 2 years 1967 69 for the esquire  
magazine and in 1978 the year of the publication dispatches was nominated for the  
national book award for nonfiction bonn 28 the critics label dispatches as new  
journalism michael herr s dispatches is the work of a war correspondent but it is not  
journalism in the ordinary sense of the word i e an objective detached reporting of  
the facts instead it is a work of the so called new journalism a hybrid form that in  
typical postmodern fashion blurs traditional genre distinctions the new journalism  
abandons all pretense of impersonal objectivity instead an intense substituting  
subjectivity that also employs such devices of fiction as characterization flashbacks  
and interior monologue carpenter 36 37 this term paper deals with the depiction of

Combat Death in Contemporary American Culture popular cultural conceptions of war since World War II explores how war has been portrayed in the United States since World War II with a particular focus on an emotionally charged but rarely scrutinized topic combat death Agnieszka Soltysik Monnet argues that most stories about war use three main building blocks melodrama adventure and horror Monnet examines how melodrama and adventure have helped make war seem acceptable to the American public by portraying combat death as a meaningful sacrifice and by making military killing look necessary and often even pleasurable horror no longer serves its traditional purpose of making the bloody realities of war repulsive but has instead been repurposed in recent years to intensify the positivity of melodrama and adventure thus this book offers a fascinating diagnosis of how war stories perform ideological and emotional work and why they have such a powerful grip on the American imagination

in philip roth a counterlife ira nadel exposes the multifaceted disposition of this major voice in american letters roth the realist the ironist the ventriloquist the impersonator the bard in navigating the intricacies and dualities of the public and private roth nadel shows the complexities the contradictions and the counterlives both lived and imagined as literary sleuth nadel has enriched the myriad possibilities for understanding this exacting and defiant writer and his work professor nadel s study is always very readable and compelling but its discussion of material that has never been accessed before is particularly exciting philip roth a counterlife engages and illuminates the scenes of discontent betrayal illness and rage in roth s own life that allow for new understandings of his work and relationships drawing on such primary source material as interviews personal correspondence and site visits nadel s biography penetrates the carefully composed narrative roth presented publicly in order to present a counter philip roth one who is at once more sympathetic to his readers than critics realize and more dynamic than even his self creation allows nadel seamlessly weaves his interpretations of roth s most provocative texts into the story of roth s own life a life shadowed by pain illness and personal injustices but also illuminated by the joys of writing ideas and friendships that will persist long after his death book jacket

this volume a collection of eleven original essays by many of the foremost u s military historians focuses on the transition of the army from parade ground to

battleground in each of nine wars the united states has fought through careful analysis of organization training and tactical doctrine each essay seeks to explain the strengths and weaknesses evidenced by the outcome of the first significant engagement or campaign of the war the concluding essay sets out to synthesize the findings and to discover whether or not american first battles manifest a characteristic rhythm america s first battles provides a novel and intellectually challenging view of how america has prepared for war and how operations and tactics have changed over time the thrust of the book the emphasis on operational history is at the forefront of scholarly activity in military history this book is part of the modern war studies series

some warriors are drawn to the thrill of combat and find it the defining moment of their lives others fall victim to fear exhaustion impaired reasoning and despair this book synthesizes the wartime experiences of american soldiers from the doughboys of world war i to the grunts of vietnam focusing on both soldiers and marines it draws on histories and memoirs oral histories psychological and sociological studies and even fiction to show that their experiences remain fundamentally the same regardless of the enemy terrain training or weaponry

this book examines how representative films about journalism from the early 1960s to the mid 1980s allegorized the working life of the journalist the central chapters deal with three popular images of journalists the war correspondent the scoop crazed reporter or ratings hungry tv executive and the investigative journalist among the films discussed are the green berets the killing fields under fire absence of malice network the china syndrome and all the president s men

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
